## Why an International Delta Alliance?



- Deltas face unique and serious challenges, they are under pressure by demographic and economic developments and will suffer the most from climate change; adaptation must happen rapidly to avoid major negative impacts on economy, environment and people.
- Many deltas experience similar problems, but information and expertise are fragmented.
- River deltas speaking with a united voice can receive more attention and support.
- Delta Alliance: an international network that will coordinate and stimulate efforts to develop, share, and implement knowledge and ideas for improving the resilience of river deltas

Working together, river deltas will learn and develop more quickly.


