Development of women led camel milk co-operatives

- Project: Enhanced community resilience to drought through innovative market based systems (EU). Focusing in Northern Kenyan Counties of Isiolo, Marsabit, Samburu, Baringo, Wajir and Tana River.
- To catalyse development of women led camel milk Cooperatives.
- Identified and engaged 173 camel milk producers along two main camel milk supply routes in Isiolo.
- Worked with Anolei Women Camel Milk Co-operative (from Pastoralist Communities)
- Getting milk supplied from over 70kilometres away




Isiolo's camel milk value chain



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
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SNV VCD and IB Approach



Inclusive Business (IB)

Business models that engage low income segments along the value chain of businesses as suppliers, distributors or consumers in a win - win situation to create economic benefits, social benefits (inclusion) and environmental





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Activities

- Training on milking techniques, milk handling and hygiene
- Supply of equipment, milking buckets (300) and aluminium cans (205) through a cost recovery mechanism.
- Bulking and cooling centre established in collaboration with Anolei Women Camel Milk Cooperative.
- Technical backstopping for the management of the bulking centre was provided by Vital Camel Milk processor which also provided a market option for the co-operative's milk.
- Enhance community's understanding of drought and its management, raise the participants' awareness on drought management through effective early warning information system, understand community's traditional coping



Results

- 173 producers and traders engaged in profitable camel milk business in Isiolo County.
- 100 women registered with Anolei trained on cooperative management, OD and financial management conducted
- A bulking centre for the co-op have been acquired and a 3000 litres cooler purchased
- 42% increase in volumes of milk handled by co-operative.
- 45% reduction in operational cost leading to increase in incomes for the members
- Increased net profit for traders from Euros 4,000 to Euros 7,000 monthly.
- Software installed for ease of data capturing and recording by the co-operative.



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
