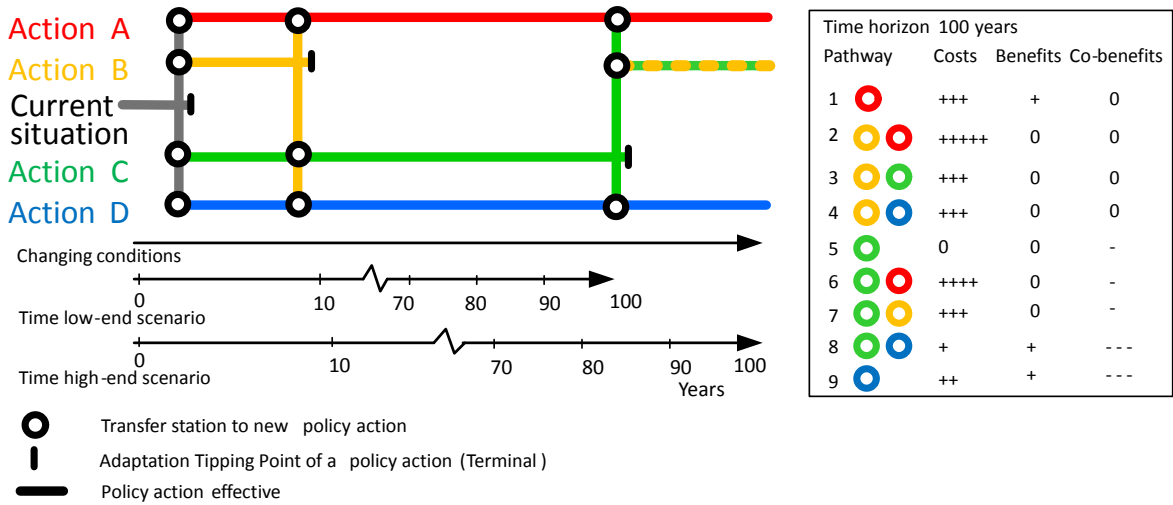

Adaptation pathways describe a **sequence of policy actions or investments** in institutions and infrastructure over time to achieve a set of pre-specified **objectives** under uncertain changing conditions.
