

Lessons learned from PfR programme in Uganda:

1. **Integrated approach** builds a more cost-effective way of adaptation capacity at household level. **Diverse livelihoods interventions**, combined with access to finance, and access to climate information, has contributed to have a strong foundation for resilience.
2. The approach has created access to **scientific and traditional** or indigenous **weather forecasts** at community level, which increased awareness on climate pattern and contributed to **early action** measures.
3. Linkages with **research and knowledge institutions** have created more access to improved, early maturing crop varieties and better farming practices, which facilitated the climate adaptation of communities.
4. Access to the **financial services** in the form of Village saving and loan schemes, has been found as a viable and strong mechanism in enhancing the bouncing back of communities after shocks.
