1. Strengthening technical/vocational agricultural training & education in Indonesia

Borderless Network offers an integrated approach to training and coaching with curriculum innovations in the horticulture, poultry and ruminant sectors at the technical vocational education & training (TVET) level in Indonesia. In order to enhance the skills and knowledge of TVET tutors, and strengthen the links between the country's private sector and TVET colleges, we trained staff in jointly-defined areas and provided input for further curriculum development. We also strengthened the links between the different TVET institutes, their alumni and private stakeholders in the region.


2. Strengthening agricultural skills and jobs in South Africa

The Strengthening Education for Agricultural Development South Africa (SEAD-SA) project is designed to close the skills gap in the country's agricultural sector. Several pilots have been launched in the poultry, dairy and piggery sectors in KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) province and horticulture sector in Western Cape (WC) province. By contributing to sustainable and inclusive development, SEAD-SA unites educational institutes from all levels and industries into one learning-oriented network. Within the network, students are offered practical teaching and exposure to relevant sectors. In return, the industry gets access to the competent staff it needs in order to increase food and water security. SEAD-SA also focusses on educating women and disadvantaged individuals, thereby supporting both sustainability and social inclusion within the agricultural sector in South Africa.


Co-creating for knowledge
