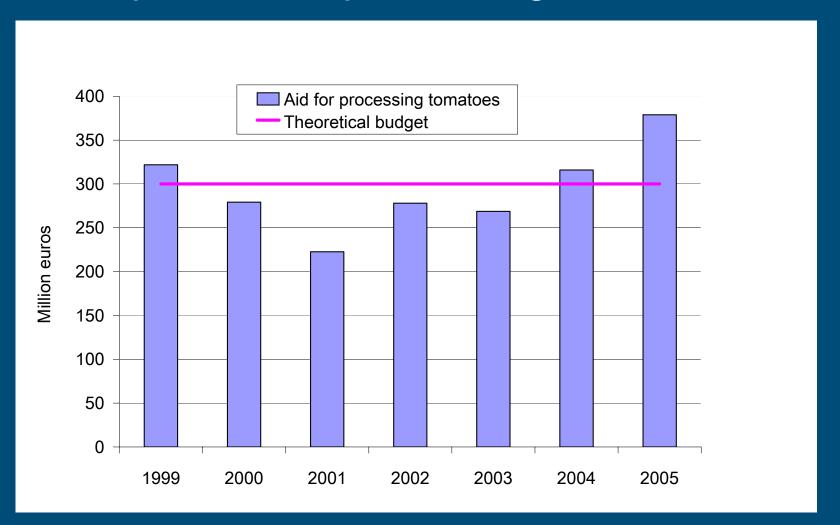


# Status quo: regime for processed tomatoes

- Aid for processing tomatoes: € 34.50 / tonne
- Aid is paid to growers, via producer organizations (contracts with processors)
- EU threshold for aid (2005): 8.65 million tonnes, equivalent to 298 million euros aid / year
- Countries receiving aid:
  - Italy, Spain, Greece, Portugal, France, Poland, Hungary, Slovak Republic, Malta, Czech Republic and Cyprus

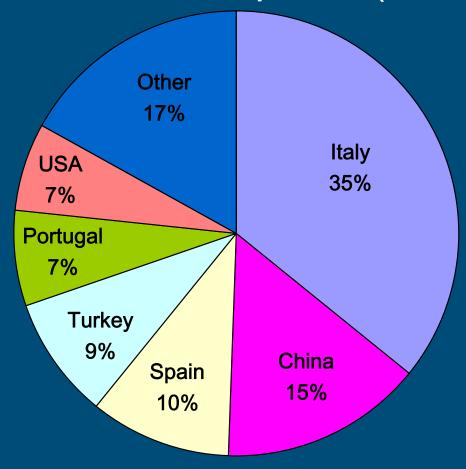


# Status quo: aid for processing tomatoes





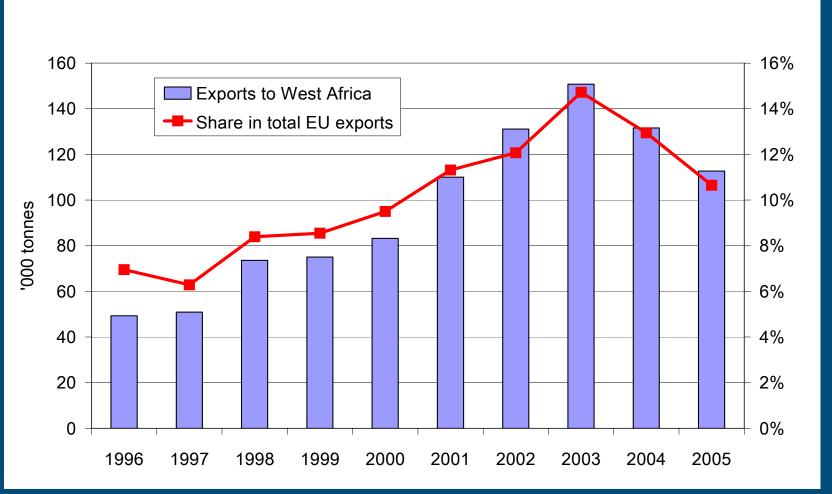
#### World export of tomato paste (CN 2002 90)



Total world export in 2004: 1.2 billion euros (source: SITC)



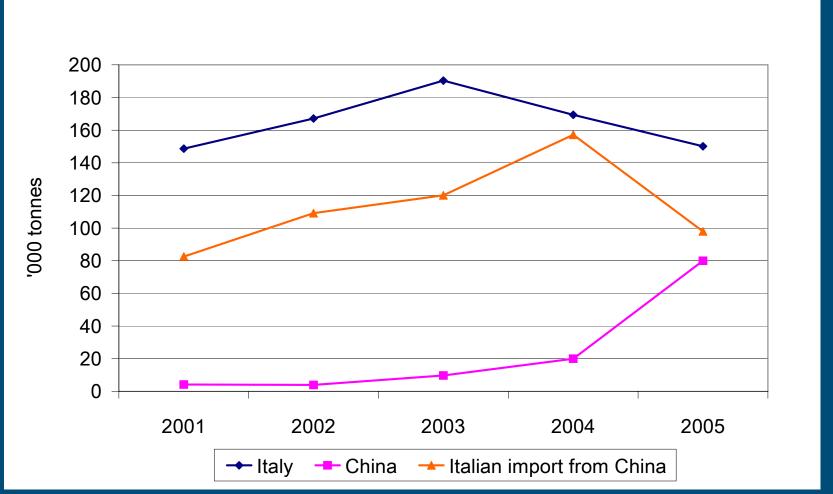
# EU tomato paste exports to West Africa

### Commission proposal for reform

- Main objective: more coherence with other CMOs
- Decoupling of processing aid (Green Box)
- Support for processed fruit and vegetables will be integrated in Single Payment Scheme (SPS)
- Application of 'cross compliance'
- Abolishment of export refunds for fresh and processed fruit and vegetables



# Implications of decoupling for supply chain

- Input prices for the processing industry will increase with 27-36%, assuming restrictions on land use
- Without these restrictions, more growers will switch to other crops and industry prices will increase further

|          | Input prices industry | Grower prices | Hectares | Output |
|----------|-----------------------|---------------|----------|--------|
| Italy    | 27.5                  | -22.5         | -15.0    | -19.5  |
| Spain    | 36.4                  | -13.6         | -9.9     | -12.6  |
| Greece   | 35.3                  | -14.7         | -9.5     | -12.5  |
| Portugal | 34.8                  | -15.2         | -10.4    | -13.4  |
| France   | 35.2                  | -14.8         | -11.8    | -14.7  |



#### Impact of EU exports on West Africa

- Tomato paste is most important processed product imported from EU
  - Mainly Italian exports (no use of export refunds)
  - Main importers: Ghana, Togo, Nigeria and Benin
- Imports discourage development of local processing industry
- Senegal and Burkina Faso use non-tariff barriers to protect domestic industry (e.g. certificates)
  - Gender equity: domestic agro-processing industry is traditionally made up of women

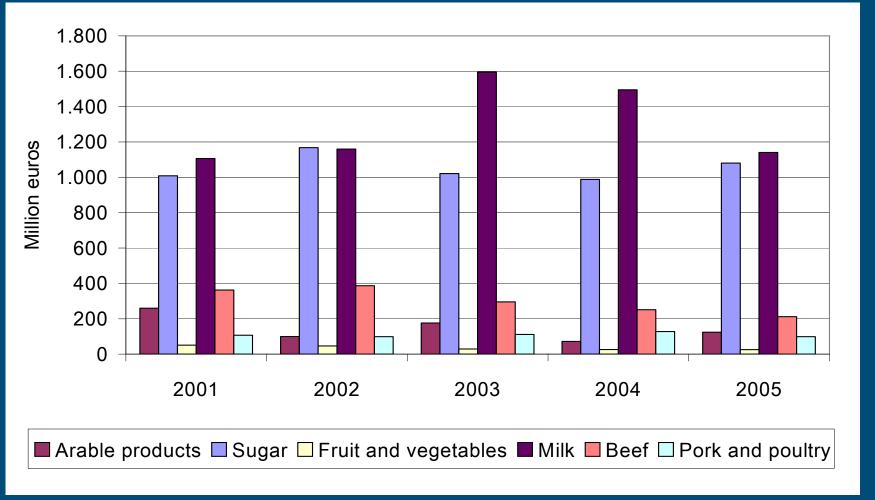


#### Impact of reform on West Africa

- Higher input prices for European processors will make European tomato paste exports less competitive → EU exports to West Africa will decrease
- Cheap Chinese exports further weaken EU position and also pose a threat to African processors
- EU tomato paste exports will also be discussed in EPA negotiations (<u>West Africa</u> is largest ACP trade partner)
  - Liberalization under EPA will lead to losses in government revenue and a further increase in imports
  - Need to include processed tomatoes in list of 'sensitive' products?



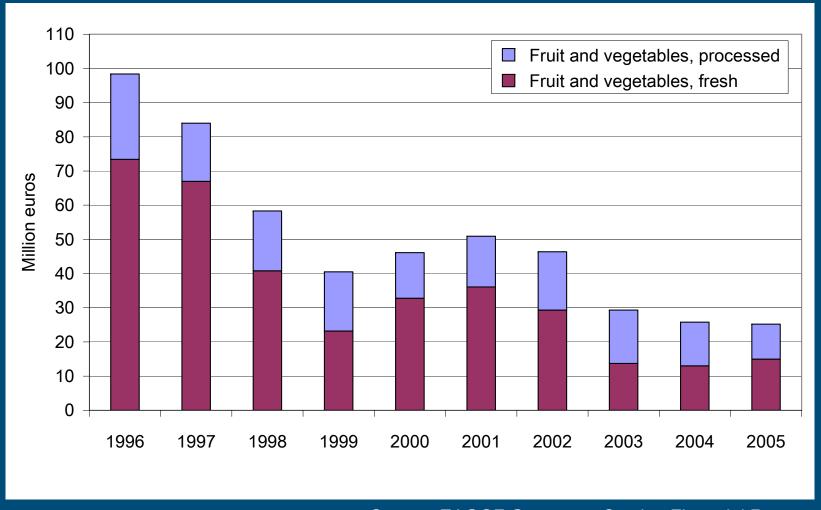
#### Export refunds: different product groups

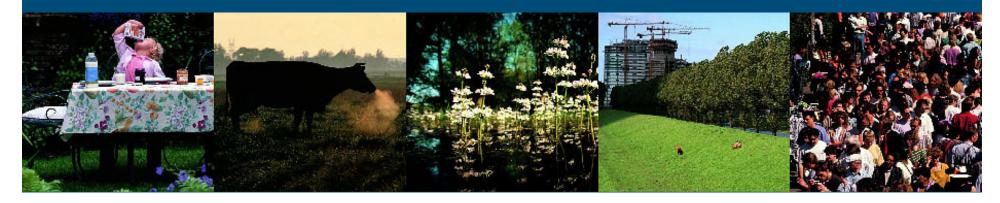


## Export refunds: fruit and vegetables (2)

- Fresh products: tomatoes, apples, oranges,
  lemons, table grapes, peaches & nectarines, nuts
- Processed products: processed cherries, dried grapes, peeled tomatoes, mixed nuts, orange juice
- In 2004/2005 12% of fruit and vegetables (fresh and processed) was exported with refunds, while the refund only represented between 0.8 en 8.9% of the export price
