

# Plan for catch comparison between old and new gear

Phase 1: gear testing

Phase 2: gear optimisation – portside/starboard comparisons

Phase 3: final catch comparison using two vessels









#### Phase 1: material too late - delay!

Overlap with phase 2 (optimisation)

Gear problems and low catches


→ Change of plans: gear optimisation on 2 vessels - PD147 (conventional gear) and PD43 (new gear)







# Take time for each step in the process & Don't fix deadlines too strictly





#### Phase 2: side-by-side fishing not that easy

Skipper about side-by-side fishing:


"It was hard: my brother and I are competitive, so we wanted to go our own way"

"I phoned the skippers and had to assume that would be sufficient"




Owner:


"planning a meeting is difficult: once the vessel is in a profitable fishery, they will not come back for a meeting"
