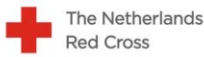

**Programme Goal 2011 – 2015:** Enhance disaster resilience at community level in 9 disaster-prone countries (Ethiopia, Guatemala, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Mali, Nicaragua, Philippines, Uganda)

**Three key strategies:**

- Facilitate community resilience projects
- Build capacity of civil society agencies
- Implement policy dialogue trajectories on resilience

**Through Integrated Risk Management:** Combine Disaster Risk Reduction, Climate Change Adaptation and Ecosystem Management & Restoration.



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**Programme Goal 2016 – 2020:** Enhance disaster resilience at community level in 10 disaster-prone countries (Ethiopia, Guatemala, Haiti, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Mali, Phillipines, South-Sudan, Uganda).

**Three key strategies:**

- Enhance knowledge / evidence base on Integrated Risk Management
- Strengthen IRM policy dialogue capacity of civil society agencies
- Implement IRM policy dialogue trajectories, with partner CSO's

**Three domains for IRM policy dialogue:**

- Policy domain (mainstream IRM in policies at global, national and local level)
- Investments domain (enhance IRM in public and private investments)
- Practise domain (enhance IRM practices in development programs)



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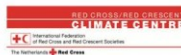
**Structure of the session**
