


Lancet 2013 calls Nutrition: A Massive Unfinished Agenda

- Ø 165M children stunted (1 in 5)
- Ø Malnutrition is responsible for 45% of < 5 deaths (3.1M)
- Ø Micronutrient deficiencies continue to be widespread (~2B, esp. women & children)
- Ø Rapidly increasing overweight/obesity (> 500M obese adults; 42M children overweight)



**Economic cost of malnutrition:
\$2.8- 3.5 trillion (4-5% global GDP) (FAO 2013)**



Food and Nutrition Security Concept














