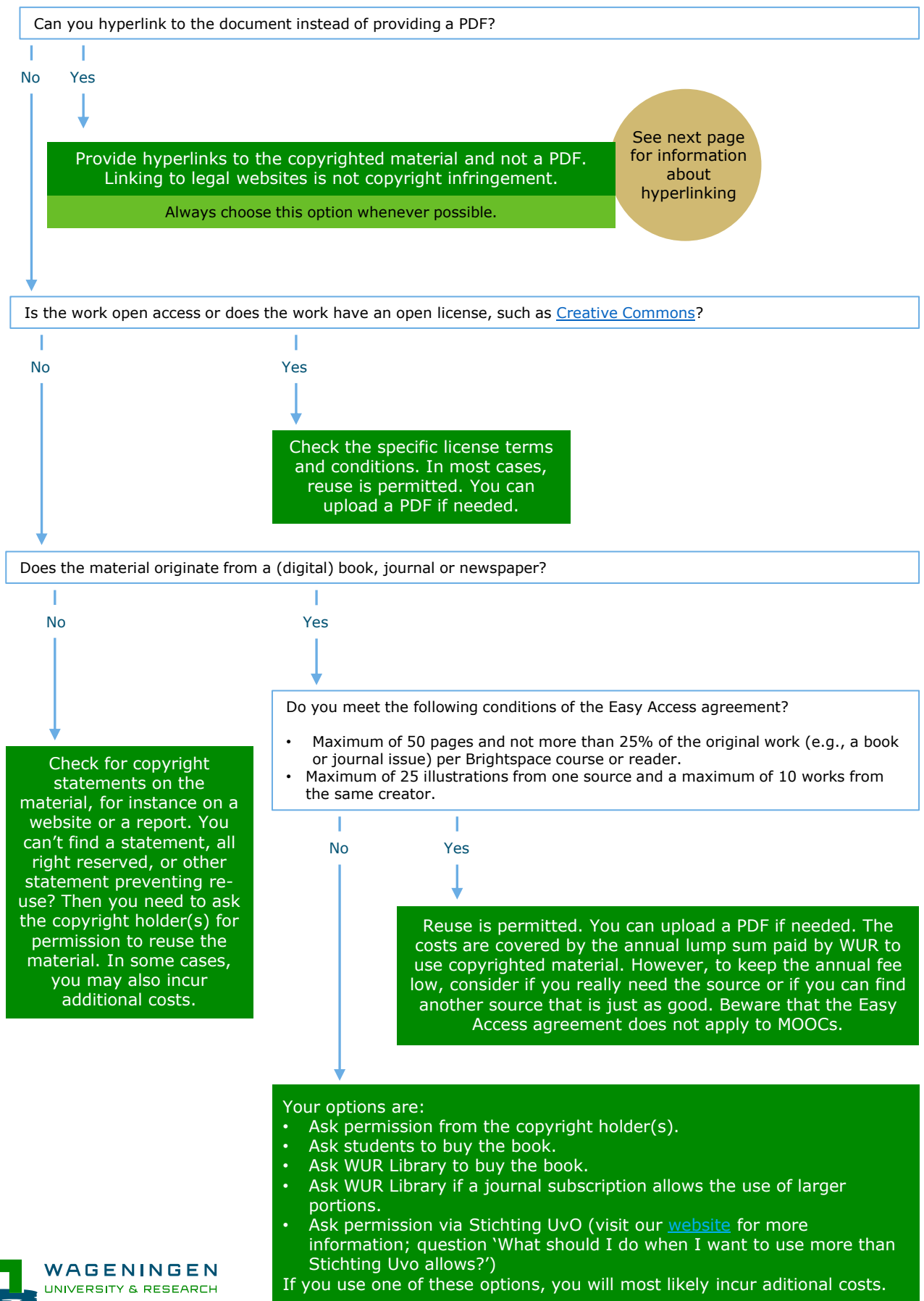


Can you share this copyrighted work in Brightspace?

Hyperlinking

What kinds of links can I use?

1. Links to a legal website.

You are not allowed to promote the use of illegal websites. Illegal copies may be hard to recognize, so at least refrain from the obvious pirate sites.

2. Stable links, such as DOI links.

URLs on a publisher's website tend to change regularly. A DOI link follows these changes and redirects mostly to the right URL. Not having to repair broken links every year will save you time.

How do I create a DOI link?

A DOI link consists of two components. Combine them to create the DOI link.

Usually found on the first page of a journal article or e-book chapter, on the publisher website, or in a publication's record in a database like Scopus.

3. EZproxy links.

An EZproxy link guarantees easy off-campus access to library sources, because it prompts students to log in. Using this link is not only a kind gesture to your students, but also lowers the hurdle for students to come to class prepared. We recommend you use EZproxy in combination with a DOI link.

How do I create an EZproxy link?

Add the following URL before the normal URL:

How do I instruct my students about off-campus access to library sources?

If students want to use the library sources off-campus, the library system needs to recognize them as Wageningen University students. Being logged in on the LMS is not enough to get library access. A log-in to the library website is required as well. For easy off-campus access, you can give your students one or more of the following instructions:

- Download the Library Access browser extension (available for Chrome, Firefox, MS Edge, Opera, and Safari).
 - i. Go to [Lean library](#) and install the extension for the browser(s) you use.
 - ii. Select Wageningen University & Research – Library
 - iii. You will get a pop-up message prompting you to log in when you try to access a publisher's website.
(most useful when student have to follow links to known publication)
- Alternatively, as a teacher, you can always use EZproxy link to ensure students will always be prompted to log in. (see above: how to make EZproxy links).
- Use the library website (<http://www.wur.nl/library>)
 - i. Log in (orange button at the top of the Library homepage)
 - ii. Search via WUR Library Search or in a specific database
(most useful when students have to search themselves for additional literature)
