Informal and formal farmer groups

Farmers are generally members of different social groups, for addressing a wide array of issues. Often these are not formally registered. We then call these 'informal organisations'.

Formal organisation of farmers

Formal farmers' organisations are registered self-help groups, associations, cooperatives, saving and credit groups, or other forms of organisation.

- · How many members do these organisations have? If possible, specify male and female members.
- · What can you say about the internal governance and management of these formal organisations?
- Can you give examples of activities that are undertaken by these formal farmers' organisations? How important are these activities for farmers?

What are strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT analysis)

Guiding questions:

- Reflecting on the existing informal and formal organisation of farmers, what are the main strengths and weaknesses of farmers' organisations?
- What are Opportunities and Threats in the external environment of these farmers' organisations?
- What do you see as the main challenges and opportunities for the effective organisation of farmers and their ability to take collective action together? What are options for action?
