## M-Check Migros

- Nutriscore for environment: Comparison between and within product categories
- Based on (EU) Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) standard
- French database with product category average scores
- Implemented by French government for all food end 2023



## PEF impacts covered



#### Normalisation

results divided by normalisation factors defined based on yearly emissions of an average global citizen



#### Weighting

normalized results multiplied by weighting factors (expert panels, planetary boundaries, reliability of indicator)



Single score



Additional environmental information



## Criticism on LCA based claims

"Norwegian Consumer Agency (June 22): [LCA based] Higg Index is misleading. The index measures the average environmental impact of a particular material, which does not necessarily apply to the exact product".

Letter of group of **NGO's** to
European Commission (March 22):
"The **PEF methodology** is **not adequate** to assess the
environmental performance of agrifood products"

Green Claims initiative (EU, March 2023): Communication of environmental impact of food based on **PEF** can **only** be done **when additional impact categories** have been included.



## Ecolabeling: Potential high impact

- Available for all food
- Broad set of **impact** categories
- Continuous improvement
- Comparison within & between product categories


- Workload/data availability
- Assurance
- Methodological challenges
- Social and animal welfare indicators

Potential to have high impact on sustainability of food



## BtB: TSC's Sustainability Insight System (THESIS)

- The Sustainability Consortium: Global Cooperation between industry, ngo's and science
- Social and environmental indicators for 115 consumer product categories
- LCA/Impact indicators preference but completed by other indicators
- Implemented by nearly 2000 companies to report to retail/wholesale/catering/hospitality



- Government initiated



- First version Ecolabel ready 2025





  right incentives applied






