COVRIN COMMUNICATION REPORT 2.

Introduction

Communication activities on the COVRIN project activities and project results are to be described in annual reports and in the COVRIN final report. These will include communications about results to the scientific community, to the stakeholders as well as the general public.

COVRIN Communication activities M48-M63

Communication activities in the second year of the COVRIN project were continued in the same way as in the first year of the project. Internal communications within the EJP One Health network were mainly executed by the coordinator and the deputy coordinator of the project. Progress of COVRIN research and network activities were presented to the OHEJP project management team (PMT) and the (Project Owner Committee) POC by the coordinator and/or the deputy coordinator.

During year 2 this progress update was also done in the scientific steering board (SSB) meeting and for the external scientific advisory board (ESAB) and the Stakeholder Committee SC). All progress presentations were shared via several social media platforms and also made available for the network partners via the OHEJP website.

At the end of second project year more than 80% of the envisaged COVRIN outcomes were presented in the COVRIN end meeting. This meeting was held in Teramo Italy. As more research outcomes and integration results and networking results became available, outcomes were also presented shortly in a COVRIN presentation at the PMT. The POC, the SSB and the SC were regularly informed of the outcomes. Presentations were well received and shared via social media and the OHEJP website.

Communication work was mainly done by the COVRIN coordinator and the deputy. In the second year of the project we were unable to recruit a communication officer within the COVRIN project. COVRIN communication activities were supported by the EJP communication team and also by several of the partner communication officers. Both the team and the individual officers have repeatedly advertised the COVRIN project results via social media. In the beginning of year 2, COVRIN stakeholders were updated by circulating an executive summary of the 12M report of the project. COVRIN research outcomes were presented during several scientist network meetings and conferences. This included the UK International Coronavirus network and online meetings organized by external parties. COVRIN supports the UK CoVnet as an advisor and by helping to organize network meetings. A conference on SARS-CoV-2 in companion animals and livestock, organized by UK-ICN in May 2023 will be supported by COVRIN and most likely attended by a number of COVRIN partners.

Conclusions COVRIN Communication activities M48-M63

COVRIN communication activities during the second year of the project consisted of a number of internal and external presentations about the project progress and outcomes. This included presentations for OHEJP internal bodies and also project funders and stakeholders. Overall, COVRIN presentations were again well received.
